## Measure of Assessment and Criteria for

## Success

Students are assessed using the PCC College-Wide Assessment Rubric for Reading applied to a reading assignment in ENG-111. The performance target is a cumulative score of 6 or higher for three assessment components each scored on a $0-3$ scale.

Students are assessed using the PCC College-Wide Assessment for Writing applied to an argumentative paper in ENG-111. The performance target is a cumulative score of 10 or higher for five assessment components each scored on a 0-3 scale.

Students are assessed using the PCC College-Wide Assessment Rubric for Oral Communication applied to a speech assignment in COM 231. The performance target is a cumulative score of 6 or higher for three assessment components each scored on a 0-3 scale.

Students are assessed using the PCC College-Wide Assessment Rubric for Math developed in the QR4U Quality Enhancement Plan applied to an assignment in MAT-143 or MAT-171. The performance target is a cumulative score of 6 or higher for three assessment components each scored on a 0-3 scale.

Students are assessed using the PCC College-Wide Assessment Rubric for Computer Competency applied to an assignment in CIS 110. The performance target is a cumulative score of 6 or higher for three assessment components each scored on a 0-3 scale.
