Associate in Applied Science

It equips students with the necessary knowledge, skills, and experience to enter the workforce and serve as a vital connection between the scene and the healthcare system under medical supervision.

EMT Initial

This course provides the basic knowledge and skills needed to deliver Basic Life Support (BLS) care and is required to progress on to more advanced levels of prehospital patient care. The next program will begin January 22, 2024 and end May 15, 2024.

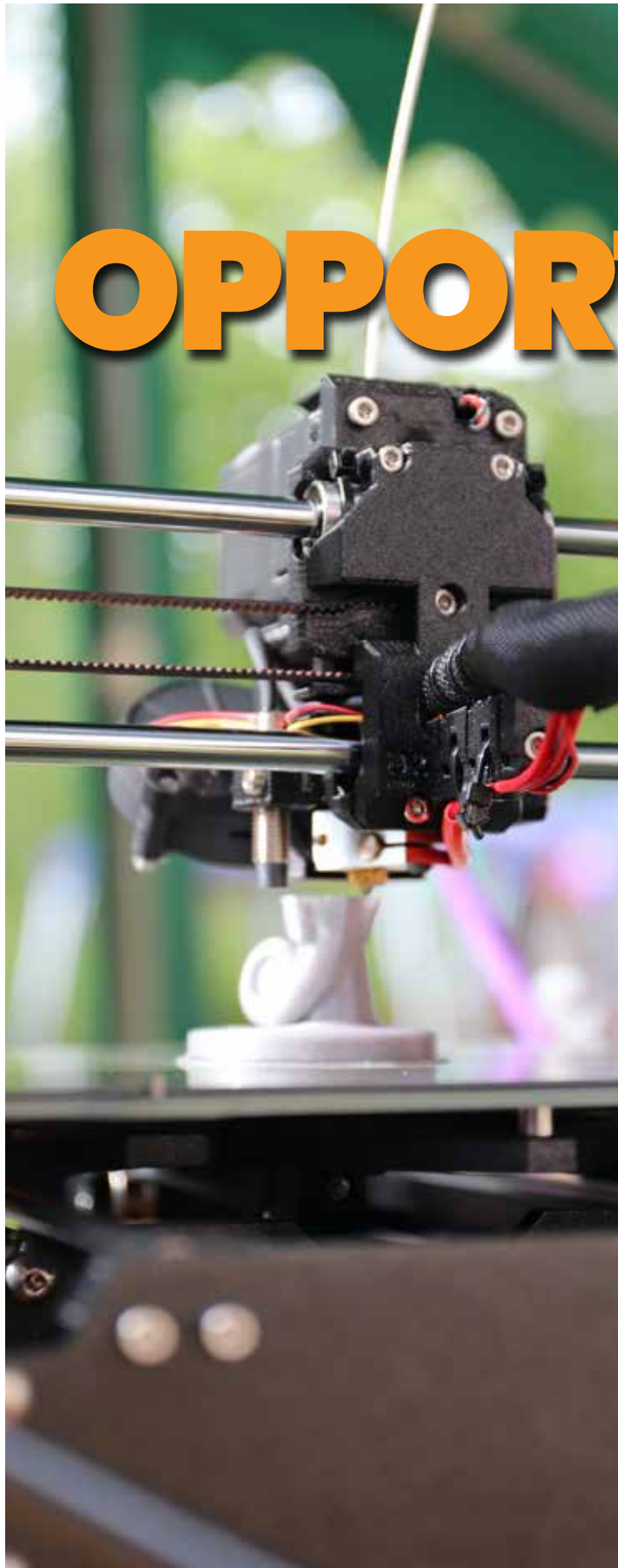

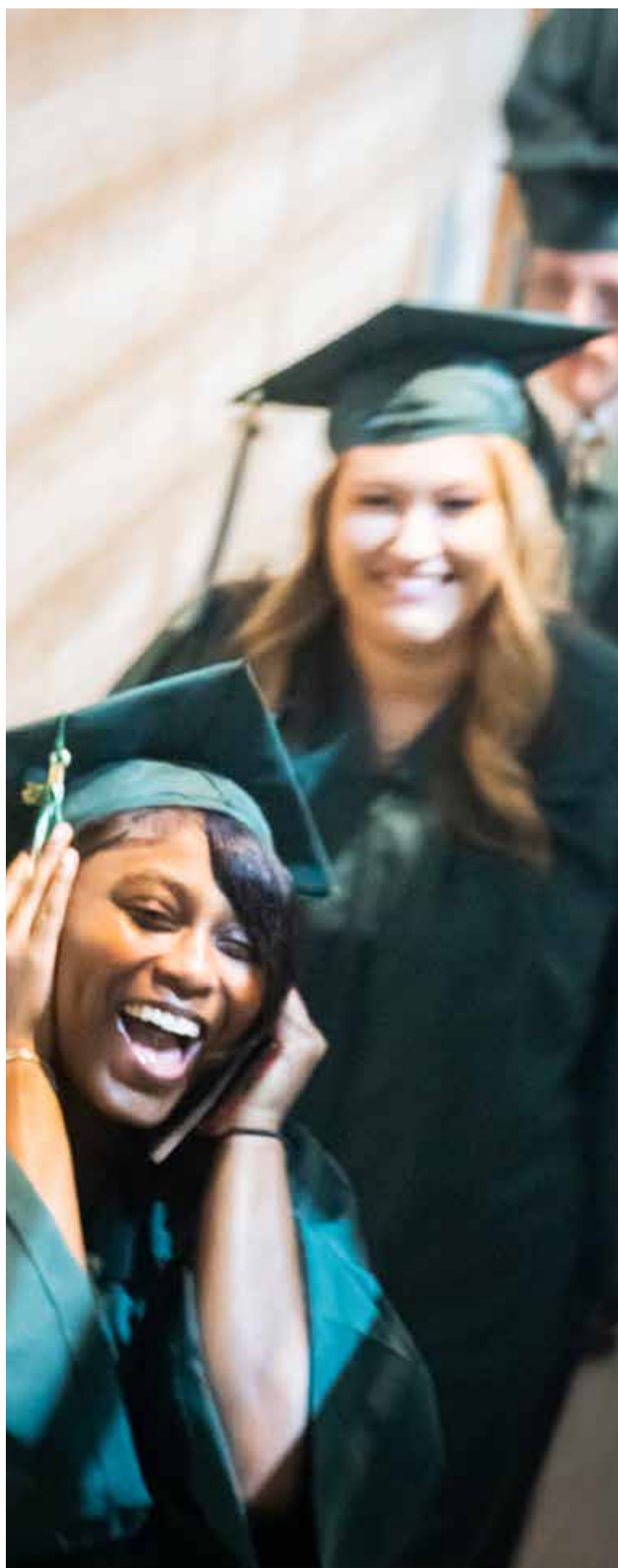
